The varsity baseball team picked up a big early season conference win as we knocked off Darlington by the score of 9-4. The Redbirds entered the contest in first place but the Chieftains pounded out 13-hits to pick up the win. Coach Thompson "Important early season win. Darlington had gotten off to a fast start in conference play and we needed to have this one. The boys played a gritty game and did a real nice job at the plate."

Elijah Cannon would get the start for the Chieftains and would find himself in a big early jam. An error and two walks would see Darlington load the bases, but Elijah buckled down and gave up just one run. In the bottom of the inning we would strike for three runs. Jared Roen would get us going with a line single to left and then steal second. Brett Hach ripped an RBI double to left center and it was 1-1. Coach Thompson "Brett has been right on the ball all season." Trevor Johnson would follow and walk. One out later the sizzling Trevor Troxel rifled a double down the left field line to score Brett and it was 2-1. Tanner Williamson rounded out the scoring when he lifted a sac fly to left to score Trevor J. And it was 3-1.

In the second Darlington would get one of those runs back. With one out, a walk and a double made it 3-2. We would threaten in the second but would not score.

In the third neither team would score as Elijah picked up pair of strike outs. The fourth would be the turning point. Darlington threatened as they picked up a pair of walks, but Elijah coaxed a two-out ground out to Brett at short, to get out of the inning.
