Purpose




Nonrecurring purposes consisting of operational costs to maintain instructional programs, staffing, technology, transportation, and facilities management.






Tax Impact

240 districts statewide went to referendum in 2024

Adjustments Already Made

- · reduction of an elementary classroom teacher resulting in larger class sizes
- elimination of two early interventionist positions
- reduction of full time library media specialist
- reduction of one full time paraprofessional support position for the 2024-2025 school year
- reduction of extra curricular opportunities for students (cheer, FBLA, assistant Forensics coach)
- elimination of early releases and moved to professional days to save transportation and student service costs, including paraprofessional support staff wages
- reduction of the number of full time support staff when part time positions could be filled
- utilization of COPS grant funding and other grant programs to supplement maintenance budget and mental health/student service programming

Question

Shall the Riverdale School District, Grant, Richland, Iowa and Crawford Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$767,500 for the 2025-2026 school year, by \$767,500 for the 2026-2027 school year, and by \$1,155,000 per year beginning with the 2027-2028 school year and ending with the 2029-2030 school year, for non-recurring purposes consisting of operational costs to maintain instructional programs, staffing, technology, transportation and facilities management?
