

REFERENDUM BASICS

The Riverdale School District is placing an operational referendum on the ballot for the **Tuesday**, **April 1**, **2025**. The referendum question asks voters permission to exceed the revenue limit. The revenue limit is a state law which caps the amount of revenue the school district receives to pay operating expenses. It is not uncommon for districts to go to referendum to raise more than their caps set by the state, which were created in the early 1990s.





Five year operational referendum starting in 2025-2026 and ending in the 2029-2030 school year.






FUND BALANCE

As a district we take great pride in keeping our fund balance healthy. Our goal is 25-30% of our expenditures. We have been able to do that over the past five years, which helped us cover the projected budget deficit in the 2024-2025 school year. Our fund balance is projected to fall beneath that amount in 26-27 and continue to decline over the next three years until we are in a negative fund balance in 28/29.




2021 AND 2025 REFERENDUM

The operational part (\$385,000) of the 2021 referendum will drop off after 26/27. The capital referendum portion will continue (\$315,000).







The Riverdale Mill Rate is the lowest in the area among area schools. The Mill Rate is the amount of property tax paid per \$1,000 of a property's assessed value. Riverdale property is taxed at \$6.43 per \$1,000. With a passed referendum the mill rate would be estimated to be \$7.49 per \$1,000. This is an estimate as more information is needed to reach the final mill rate. That estimate would put Riverdale still near the lowest in the area.

ADJUSTMENTS MADE TO DISTRICT

Reduction of an elementary classroom teacher resulting in larger class sizes

Reduction of extra curricular opportunties for students
(Cheer, FBLA, one Forensics coach)

Elimination of two early interventionist positions

Elimination of early releases and moved to fewer professional days to save transportation and student service costs, including paraprofessional support staff wages.

Reduction of full time Library media specialist

Reduction of the number of full time support staff when part time positions could be filled

Reduction of one full time paraprofessional support for the 24-25 school year

Utilization of COPS Grant funding and other grant programs to supplement maintenance budget and health/student service programming

WHAT WILL THE REVENUE BE USED FOR?

The Riverdale School District has a projected deficit of \$355,000 in 2024-2025, \$610,000 in 2025-2026, \$885,000 in 2026-2027. In order to maintain a healthy fund balance and staffing, we are asking the taxpayers to approve the proposed non-recurring operating referendum.

The funding will be used to:

- maintain programs such as full day 4K, current class sizes, JH and HS course offerings, high school AP and CAPP courses, college and career opportunities and extracurricular and sporting options.
- update current transportation fleet and recruit drivers
- maintain technology services 1-1 devices, student education
- contribute to the facilities building and maintenance projects
- manage a fiscally responsible fund balance
- competitive in wages and benefits for all teaching, support, custodial, cook, office staff and bus drivers




Failed Referendum Impact Student Impact

- 1. Increase Class Sizes.
- 2. Reduce academic and extracurricular programming including sports, class trips and club opportunities.
- 3. Options for college and career readiness would be significantly reduced.
- 4. Students would be less supported.

Staff Impact

- 1. Wage and Benefit adjustments for staff.
- 2. Reduction in full time and part time staff.
- 3. Reduction in four teaching positions.
- 4. Ability to attract and retain quality staff in an already competitive market will become increasingly difficult.



HOW WILL THE BALLOT READ?



Question:

Shall the Riverdale School District, Grant, Richland, Iowa and Crawford Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$767,500 for the 2025-2026 school year, by \$767,500 for the 2026-2027 school year, and by \$1,155,000 per year beginning with the 2027-2028 school year and ending with the 2029-2030 school year, for non-recurring purposes consisting of operational costs to maintain instructional programs, staffing, technology, transportation and facilities management?
